



Garden Moth Trapping in 2014








Garden Moth Trappers – What more can you do?

- Run your trap as often as possible: Twice a week rather than once a week will double your chances of recording rare & uncommon species
- Don't forget the ends of the season
- Try and record more micros
- Run your trap in a friend or family member's garden especially if they live in under-recorded areas. A couple of nights in the main season could add 100+ dots to distribution maps
- Recruit (& support?) new garden trappers do you know anyone living in the under-recorded areas. Budget (£45)/loan traps available
- Move house to an under-recorded area?!






This map is a little deceptive; it appears to show a good distribution of records, but it does not reflect the great disparity in the number of 2014 records from each tetrad

Targeted species recording

- We know that many species are common & widespread
- Or rare and/or only found in certain areas/habitats within VC55
- But there are others where their status & distribution is not fully known:
 - Species not recorded for a number of years- are they extinct?
 - Species only recorded a few times are they present elsewhere?
 - Species as yet undiscovered.
 - Species doubtfully recorded can we confirm their presence?
 - Species under-recorded because they don't come to light

N.B. Larval foodplant = Wormwood or Mugwort


376 Welsh Clearwing

N.B. Larval foodplant = Birch




Look for signs of larval emergence on birches in Charnwood

Rare – not recorded since 2005




Moths often sit on broom at night – check by torchlight

Ketton Quarry N.R., particularly along northern boundary needs monitoring. Being double-brooded, this day-flying moth has a relatively long flight period.


1662 Light Orange Underwing
