


Like the Scarce Footman, this species rests with its wings rolled-up (unlike the Common Footman, that rests with its wings flat), but Hoary Footman is usually much paler in colour, with yellow edge to costa (leading edge) of forewing less pronounced. However, some very likely looking ones have turned out to be Scarce Footman upon dissection. Therefore, it is recommended that, for each new location, a photo is sent to me for confirmation. Depending on the photo and/or location, I may then want to arrange for the specimen to be dissected.
